Colonel (P) Jack F. Nevin**



Colonel (P) Jack F. Nevin is the Chief Judge (IMA) US Army Court of Criminal Appeals a position he assumed 31 May 2004. In his civilian capacity he presides as a District Court Judge in Tacoma Washington. Prior to his appointment as a District Court Judge in January of 1997, COL Nevin tried cases for fifteen years, including prosecution of white-collar crimes and homicides, and representation of law enforcement agencies in civil litigation.

Colonel (P) Nevin has lectured nationally for the International Association of Chiefs of Police, National District Attorneys Association, the National Association of Attorneys General, American Prosecutors Research Institute, the Federal Bureau of Investigation and various state prosecutor organizations. He is on the faculty of both the National Institute of Trial Advocacy and the Washington State Judicial College. In a civilian capacity he served as the Presiding Judge of the United Nations Detention Review Commission Kosovo and taught rule of law for the Department of Justice in Bosnia.

Colonel (P) Nevin has taught on the undergraduate and graduate level for approximately twenty-four years. Currently, he serves as an Adjunct Professor of Trial Advocacy at the Seattle University School of Law. Colonel (P) Nevin has published extensively in subjects ranging from military retirement benefits as community property to police civil liability and asset forfeiture. He has written Montana's Real Property Forfeiture Statute: Will it Pass Constitutional Muster? Volume 54 No. 1 Montana Law Review, Winter 1993 and *Tellevik v. Real Property: Washington's Constitutional Dilemma* Volume 29 No. 2 of the Gonzaga Law Review, Spring 1994.

Colonel (P) Nevin is a ROTC graduate of Washington State University and holds a Master of Science, Master of Business Administration and Juris Doctor degrees from Gonzaga University. From 1978 to 1981 he served on active duty at Fort Lewis Washington in criminal law, administrative law and legal assistance positions.

Colonel (P) Nevin most recent reserve assignment was as Chief of Staff 70th Regional Readiness Command. He began his USAR career in 1982 as assistant SJA for the 174th General Support Group at Fort Lawton Washington. His subsequent affiliations included the 222nd, 223rd, 89th JAG Detachments and the 6th Military Law Center where he served in a variety of positions including trial counsel, defense counsel, team leader and S-1. From April of 1996 until July of 1999 he served as Deputy Staff Judge Advocate for the 70th Regional Support Command. From July of 1999 to October of 2001 he served as Commander of the Sixth Judge Advocate Legal Support Organization. From October of 2001 to May of 2003 he served as Staff Judge Advocate, 70th Regional Readiness Command. His reserve career has included tours of duty in Africa, Asia, Europe, Central America and South America. He is a 1996 graduate of the Air War College and 1998 graduate of the Army War College.
